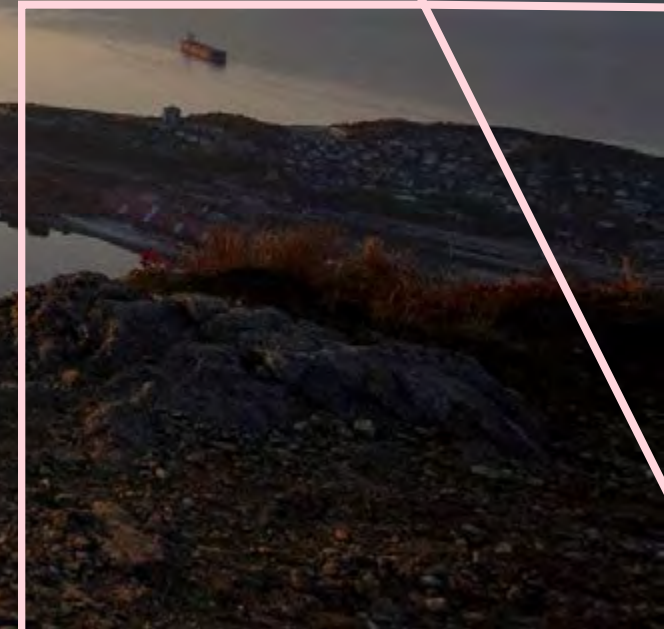

Weekly Saturday flights from April 4th to October 25th, and two weekly flights (Saturday and Tuesday) from July 1st to August 8th.



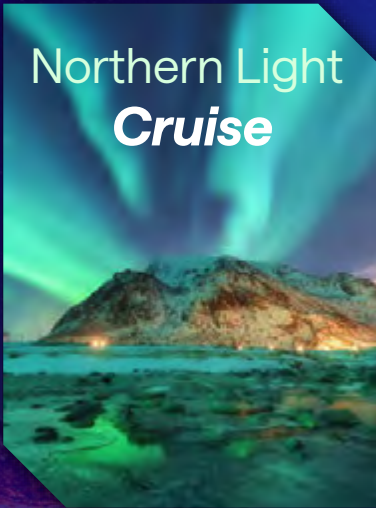

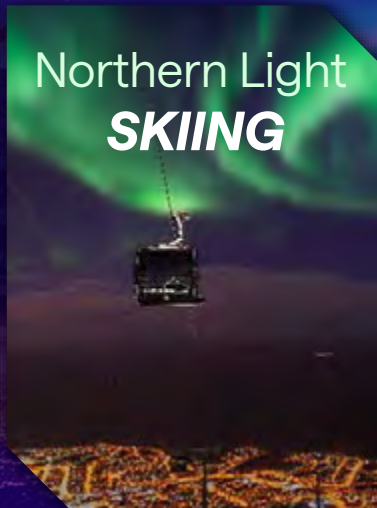

Skiing

In addition, Narvikfjellet has one of Scandinavia's **largest** drop heights and **excellent** terrain for off-piste skiing.



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Narvikfjellet

At the foot of the **mountain**, you will find Narvik town, which turns Narvikfjellet into Norway's most **urban** mountain resorts.

Narvikfjellet is a facility for **everyone**. During the ski season, families and beginners can benefit from a **separate** children's ski band and several areas with **jumps**, children's games and park items.



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Riksgränsen

High above the **Arctic Circle** lies Riksgränsen – Sweden's most **legendary ski resort**, where the lifts stay open under the **midnight sun**.

Riksgränsen offers skiing for everyone, from **gentle slopes** for beginners to **challenging off-piste runs** and natural terrain parks for the adventurous. The **unique mix** of Arctic wilderness and vibrant ski culture makes Riksgränsen **an icon** among Scandinavian mountain destinations.



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Björkliden

At the edge of Lapporten's dramatic **mountainscape**, you will find Björkliden – a **classic Swedish ski resort** with breathtaking views over Lake Torneträsk.

Families and beginners can **enjoy easy slopes**, a **children's area** with its own lift, and playful snow parks, while **experienced skiers** can **explore longer runs**, off-piste terrain, and guided adventures into the **Arctic mountains**.



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World Championships

Narvik is **hosting** the FIS World Championships in alpine skiing in **2029**.

This is the **biggest** winter sport event in the world after the Olympic games.

When Narvik was **selected** to host the championships, it triggered an **investment** in skiing facilities and accommodation worth **1.5 billion NOK**.

When you have ascended through the **wonderful** mountain landscape, you will be rewarded with **panoramic views** of the town, surrounded by **deep fjords** and **majestic mountains**.



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Conquer the Trails

The Arctic Train

The Arctic Train travels through a desolate, wild and **beautiful** landscape on Europe's **northernmost** railway. The 43-kilometer long Ofot line stretches from Narvik in Nordland towards the Swedish **border**.

With **towering** mountains, **dramatic** waterfalls and fantastic views of the fjord, this journey goes through a beautiful and **wild** arctic landscape. The train makes several stops along the way to **ensure** you get the most out of the trip.

SeeNarvik

SeeNarvik offers **unique** boat experiences in the waters around Narvik. Join a fishing trip with local guides or explore the area's **dramatic** history on a WWII-themed boat tour.

Using an underwater drone, we dive down to the **famous** shipwrecks in Narvik harbor and **stream** live footage directly to screens on board.

In winter, we also run Northern Lights cruises into the calm waters of **Beisfjord**. Real stories. Real nature. Close-up experiences.





Polar Park

Polar Park is the **world's** northernmost **animal park**, and home to Norway's large **predators** such as bears, wolves, and lynx as well as deer, moose, reindeer and muskox.

The park, which opened in 1994, is focusing on exhibiting animals in their **natural** surroundings, allowing visitors to see them in a setting that closely resembles their **natural** habitat
